# NO SUMMER BREAK FOR ADVOCACY

CEO'S CORNER

ven though Parliament is on summer break, CBAA's work on our members' behalf doesn't take a holiday. Advocacy will continue at a strong pace behind the scenes, with a number of key files in our sights.

Our intensive work continues with officials at Transport Canada Civil Aviation (TCCA) to develop the new regulatory framework. Thanks to CBAA's efforts that led to a seminal focus group meeting with operators, Transport is seriously considering the International Standard for Business Aircraft Operations (IS-BAO). IS-BAO is a code of best practice developed by the industry for the benefit of the industry and promotes highly professional operational practices. IS-BAO is intended to build upon the excellent safety record already established by business aviation.

While we commend
Transport Canada on
taking this road, these new
regulations are about a year
away. Until then, operators
must continue to comply
with the complex processes
outlined in the government's
current Interim Order. CBAA
is doing everything possible to

encourage TCCA to reduce this excessive regulatory burden in the short term.

Another major issue for business aviators is the new proposed Fatigue Management rules released in a draft report issued by a Canadian Aviation Regulation Advisory Council (CARAC) Technical Committee Working Group on Fatigue Management. Its recommendations are inappropriate for business aviation, which needs to manage risk associated with fatigue differently from commercial operations. The one size fits all approach taken by this working group report simply doesn't work. CBAA, a member of the working group has reached out to members

for their input and comments. Our aim is to ensure that the draft report is amended and the rules developed for business aviation are appropriate to our type of operations.

CBAA has worked for several years to improve facilitation services at airports. We scored a major victory on this front, with the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) now allowing business aviation aircraft carrying up to 39 persons on board, including crew, to report to the CBSA through the Telephone Reporting Centre (TRC) and obtain CBSA clearance at Fixed Base Operator (FBO) locations, or other predetermined sites at the airport, instead of being cleared at the main airport terminal. Over the summer, we will continue to work to identify and rectify other

facilitation issues. Looking farther ahead, planning is already well underway for the 3rd annual Cross Border Conference held jointly with NBAA in Ottawa, Dec. 6-7.

Finally, we continue to upgrade our services to members. Please visit our website often for updates on these and other issues – members will get a preview of the latest news in our weekly bulletin. Also for members, our web-based Operator Resource Centre provides key and current information on a range of issues and operational procedures and notices.
