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Advocacy Update

CBSA WORKS WITH CBAA TO CLARIFY PILOT OBLIGATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR TELEPHONE REPORTING

The Canada Border Services Agency has worked with CBAA to assist pilots of private aircraft for their entry into Canada to help reduce the time and effort required for pilots in command (PIC) to accurately report their arrivals.

EUROPE BLINKS ON EU-ETS THANKS TO INTERNATIONAL LOBBYING EFFORT

As a result of the lobbying efforts of governments and associations, including the CBAA, the EU is reconsidering its implementation of EU-ETS. Many technicalities need to be resolved, but the political move by the European Commission allows for a better atmosphere for discussions at ICAO to find a harmonized global solution to air transport's impact on climate change.

This will be an important subject of discussion at the International Business Aviation Council's (IBAC) Environmental Issues Working Group (EIWG) meeting in Montreal (Dec. 11 and 12, 2012) in which the CBAA is a full participant. The EIWG will examine both Market Based Measures (MBMs) as well as a range of other measures (technical, operational, etc.) to prepare to participate in further discussions leading up to and including next year's ICAO Assembly.

CBAA PREPARES DISSENT TO FATIGUE MANAGEMENT REPORT

The Fatigue Management working group report was presented to the CARAC Technical Committee meeting on Nov. 6, 2012. At this meeting, the CBAA reiterated that the fatigue management regulations proposed in the report are totally inappropriate for business aviation. The report will likely be sent to the Civil Aviation Regulatory Committee (CARC) for review and the determination of next steps, and the CBAA will submit its formal dissent by the Jan. 31, 2013, deadline. CBAA has asked that business aviation be excluded from the new fatigue management regulations, as the regulatory framework for business aviation currently under development already includes fatigue management.
